

Study Abroad

The School of Art History hosts two Study Abroad opportunities. The first is a 2-½-week Summer Intersession program that explores the artistic and architectural wonders of a European country. We travel across its territories by bus and train to explore the archaeology, art, and architecture of a country while immersing ourselves in the culture and history of the region.

The second is a 7-1/2-week Summer Residency program based in Florence, Italy with a focus on the history of the Italian Renaissance. With this immersive program set in the birthplace of the Renaissance, you will walk the streets, visit the sites, and explore the artistic works that made this period such a tremendously provocative and influential time in history.
